CHUCK HAGEL

24th Secretary of Defense

COL. EDWARD SHAMES

The last living officer from the famed 'Band of Brothers'

THE TUSKEGEE TOP GUNS

Winners of the first 'Top Gun' style competition in 1949, Tuskegee Airmen Lt. Col. James Harvey & Lt. Col. Harry Stewart

ROSIE THE RIVETERS

The women who went to the factories during WWII to build the planes, tanks, and ships used to win the war.

TOM RICE

Paratrooper with the 101st Airborne on D-Day, still parachuting at 100 years old.

THE 442ND REGIMENTAL COMBAT

Veterans of the famed all-Japanese American unit that would become the most highly decorated of the war for its size.

MAJ. GEN. JAMES E. LIVINGSTON Recipient of the Medal of Honor for valor in Vietnam.

PETER MACDONALD

USMC veteran and among the last surviving Navajo Code Talkers.

VIVIAN 'MILLIE' BAILEY

Among the first African American women to serve in the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps, commissioned as a First Lieutenant. Recently gained fame for skydiving at age 102.

BOB PASSANISI

Served with Merrill's Marauders, the famed unit from the China-Burma-India Theater of WWII.

COL. P.J. DAHL

Ace pilot of WWII with nine confirmed kills and one probable, the highest ranking living P-38 ace.

THE RITCHIE BOYS

Veterans of an elite unit of Army soldiers, trained in intelligence and interrogation at Camp Ritchie, MD, comprised largely of German and Austrian Jewish immigrants who would return to Europe to fight Hitler.

CAPT. ROYCE WILLIAMS

Joining the Navy in 1943, best known for a mission in Korea dubbed Top Secret for decades, where he shot down four Soviet MiG-15s.

ANTHONY PROCASSINI

Mortar crewman with the 1st Marine Division, among the first to land in the epic battle for Peleliu, later among the first wave of Marines to land on Okinawa.

VINCENT SPERANZA

101st Airborne paratrooper from WWII, most known for his famous 'beer run' at Bastogne, where he found a working tap in a bombed-out tavern, filling his helmet to run to his comrades.

GEORGE CIAMPA

Landed on Utah Beach on D-Day, served with the 607th Graves Registration Company. Tasked with the solemn duty of burying the dead - some 75,000 bodies from June 6 to the end of the war.

FRANK EMOND

Served aboard battleship USS Pennsylvania during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941, witnessing the first bomb dropped, exploding on Ford Island.

CLINTON J. HILL

U.S. Army veteran and Secret Service agent to five presidents, most known for his act of bravery on November 22, 1963 rushing to shield Mrs. Kennedy and the already stricken president as shots rang out.
